A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING REQUIRING PUBLIC SCHOOLS TO CONDUCT EMERGENCY

102 SAFETY DRILLS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not necessarily reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted.)

Requires public elementary, secondary, and postsecondary schools to conduct certain emergency safety drills beginning in the 2010-11 academic year.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

1	SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly
2	hereby finds and declares that:
3	(a) Colorado elementary, secondary, and postsecondary public
4	schools rely on many people and organizations to respond in a
5	coordinated manner to emergencies;
6	(b) School staff and students must practice emergency response
7	procedures and lifesaving protocols, developed with community partners,
8	to better prepare and protect themselves and others during emergencies;
9	and
10	(c) These important emergency response procedures and
11	lifesaving protocols, including all-hazard drills, should be part of a
12	flexible, but mandatory, school safety program to better protect students
13	and staff, while minimizing lost instruction time for students.
14	(2) The general assembly therefore finds that schools will benefit
15	from regular lifesaving protocol drills involving both students and school
16	staff, including earthquake drills, lockdown drills, reverse evacuation
17	drills, shelter-in-place drills, and severe weather drills, in addition to the
18	fire safety drills that schools currently conduct.

12	TORNADO.
13	(VI) "SHELTER-IN-PLACE DRILL" MEANS A DRILL IN WHICH THE
14	OCCUPANTS OF A SCHOOL BUILDING SEEK SHELTER IN THE SCHOOL
15	BUILDING FROM AN EXTERNAL THREAT FROM HAZARDOUS MATERIALS.
16	(c) THE POLICY SHALL REQUIRE, AT A MINIMUM, THAT:
17	(I) EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL CONDUCT AT LEAST TWO DIFFERENT
18	TYPES OF LIFESAVING PROTOCOL DRILLS DURING EACH ACADEMIC YEAR,
19	AT LEAST ONE OF WHICH SHALL BE CONDUCTED WITHIN SIXTY DAYS AFTER

14	(2) Beginning in the 2010-11 Academic Year, each

16	DIFFERENT TYPES OF LIFESAVING PROTOCOL DRILLS DURING EACH
17	ACADEMIC YEAR, AT LEAST ONE OF WHICH SHALL BE CONDUCTED WITHIN
18	SIXTY DAYS AFTER THE START OF THE ACADEMIC YEAR. THE INSTITUTION
19	OF HIGHER EDUCATION SHALL PROVIDE ADVANCE NOTICE OF A LIFESAVING
