SENATE BILL NO. 2284

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-106-29, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
 TO PROVIDE THAT MISSISSIPPI STUDENTS WHO HAVE AT LEAST A 3.0 GRADE
 POINT AVERAGE IN HIGH SCHOOL AND MAINTAIN THAT AVERAGE SHALL BE
 ELIGIBLE FOR A SCHOLARSHIP EQUAL TO THE FULL COST OF TUITION AT
 ANY STATE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER LEARNING OR PUBLIC COMMUNITY
 COLLEGE, REGARDLESS OF THE IMMIGRATION STATUS OF SUCH STUDENT; AND
 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-106-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 11 37-106-29. (1) There is established the Mississippi
- 12 Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Program for college or
- 13 university freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors to be
- 14 administered by the Mississippi Postsecondary Education Financial
- 15 Assistance Board established under Section 37-106-9, Mississippi
- 16 Code of 1972, which shall set the dates and deadlines for applying
- 17 for an award under this section. The board shall establish such
- 18 rules and regulations as it deems necessary and proper to carry
- 19 out the purposes and intent of this section.

20	(2)	The college or university shall approve grants to
21	full-time	freshmen, sophomore, junior and senior Mississippi
22	residents	who meet the general requirements for student
23	eligibilit	ty as provided in subsection (4) of this section.

(3) Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants shall be for Mississippi students from any Mississippi family whose prior year adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds the maximum allowed to qualify for full Pell Grant eligibility and campus-based federal Those Mississippi students receiving less than the full Pell Grant award, as determined by the institution, shall receive a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant in an amount not to exceed the maximum Pell Grant allowable for that individual The award shall be applied to tuition, rooms and meals, books, materials and fees not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for junior and senior students attending state institutions of higher learning in Mississippi or four-year regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit colleges and universities in Mississippi, and Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for freshmen and sophomores attending state institutions of higher learning or public community or junior colleges in Mississippi, or regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit two-year or four-year colleges in Mississippi, which will be prorated per term, semester or quarter of the academic year for costs of

attendance, calculated according to the formula specified in

subsection (8) of this section. Provided, however, that the award

- 52 (4) The general requirements for initial eligibility of
- 53 students for Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants
- 54 consist of the following:
- 55 (a) Member of a Mississippi family whose prior year
- 56 adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds the maximum allowed to qualify
- 57 for Pell Grant eligibility and campus-based federal aid.
- 58 (b) Acceptance for enrollment at any state institution
- 59 of higher learning or public community or junior college located
- 60 in Mississippi, or any regionally accredited, state-approved,
- 61 nonprofit four- or two-year college or university located in
- 62 Mississippi as listed in subsection (d) of this Section
- 63 37-106-29(4): (i) a minimum grade point average of 2.5 calculated
- on a 4.0 scale after seven (7) semesters certified by the high
- 65 school counselor or other authorized school official on the
- 66 application and graduation from high school verified by the
- 67 institution before disbursement of award and has scored fifteen
- 68 (15) on the American College Test Program (ACT); or (ii) has
- 69 attended a home education program during grade levels 9 through

- 70 12, and has scored fifteen (15) on the American College Testing
- 71 Program; or (iii) satisfactory completion of the General
- 72 Educational Development Test (GED) or have successfully completed
- 73 the International Baccalaureate Program and has scored fifteen
- 74 (15) on the American College Testing Program; provided, however,
- 75 that any student entering a vocational or technical program of
- 76 study, or who has satisfactorily completed the General Education
- 77 Development Test and attends a community or junior college will
- 78 not be required to have a test score under the American College
- 79 Testing Program except those students enrolled in courses of
- 80 academic study. Any student currently enrolled in any qualified
- 81 institution shall have to only meet the same requirements as
- 82 students who are applying for a renewal award.
- 83 (c) Resident status for purposes of receiving grants
- 84 under this section shall be determined in the same manner as
- 85 resident status for tuition purposes as set forth in Sections
- 37-103-1 through 37-103-29, with the exception of Section
- 87 37-103-17.
- 88 (d) Must attend one (1) of the following institutions
- 89 of higher learning: Alcorn State University, Delta State
- 90 University, Jackson State University, Mississippi State
- 91 University, Mississippi University for Women, Mississippi Valley
- 92 State University, University of Mississippi, University of
- 93 Southern Mississippi, Coahoma Community College, Copiah-Lincoln
- 94 Community College, East Central Community College, East

- 95 Mississippi Community College, Hinds Community College, Holmes
- 96 Community College, Itawamba Community College, Jones County Junior
- 97 College, Meridian Community College, Mississippi Delta Community
- College, Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College, Northeast 98

- 105 By accepting a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance
- 106 Grant, the student is attesting to the accuracy, completeness and
- 107 correctness of information provided to demonstrate the student's
- 108 eligibility. Falsification of such information shall result in
- the denial of any pending grant and revocation of any award 109
- 110 currently held to the extent that no further payments shall be
- 111 Any student knowingly making false statements in order to made.
- receive a grant shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable, upon 112
- 113 conviction thereof, by a fine of up to Ten Thousand Dollars
- 114 (\$10,000.00), a prison sentence of up to one (1) year in the
- 115 county jail, or both, and shall be required to return all
- 116 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants wrongfully
- 117 obtained.
- 118 Eligibility for renewal of Mississippi Resident Tuition
- Assistance Grants shall be evaluated at the end of each semester, 119

120	or term,	, of each	academic	year.	As	a	condition	for	renewal,	a
121	student	shall:								

- 122 (a) Make steady academic progress toward a certificate
 123 or degree, as outlined in the school Satisfactory Academic
 124 Progress Standards and certified by the institution's registrar.
 - (b) Maintain continuous enrollment for not less than two (2) semesters or three (3) quarters in each successive academic year, unless granted an exception for cause by the administering agency; examples of cause may include student participation in a cooperative program, internship program or foreign study program. If a student fails to maintain continuous enrollment, and is not granted an exception for cause by the administering agency, the student is ineligible to receive the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant during the following semester or trimester or term of the regular academic year.
- 135 Have a cumulative grade point average of at least 136 2.50 calculated on a 4.0 scale at the end of each semester or 137 trimester or term. Provided, however, that any student who is 138 receiving an award equal to the full amount of the tuition at an 139 institution of higher learning or public community college, the 140 student shall maintain a cumulative grade point average of at 141 least 3.0 calculated on a 4.0 scale at the end of each semester or 142 trimester or term.
- 143 (7) Each student, each year, must complete a Free 144 Application for Federal Student Aid form or a Statement of

- 146 his/her eligibility for a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance
- 147 Grant.
- 148 (8) (a) The amount of the Mississippi Resident Tuition
- 149 Assistance Grant awarded to any one (1) student, up to the maximum
- 150 amount provided in subsection (3) of this section, shall be the
- 151 difference of the student's cost of attendance at his accredited
- college of choice and the amount of federal aid such student may 152
- 153 receive, not to supplant but to supplement the amount of any
- federal aid awarded to the student. Cost of attendance is the 154
- 155 tuition and fees of the applicable institution plus an allowance
- 156 for room and meals and books and materials.
- 157 Payment of the Mississippi Resident Tuition
- 158 Assistance Grant shall be made payable to the recipient and the
- 159 educational institution and mailed directly to the institution, to
- 160 be applied first to tuition.
- 161 In order for an institution to remain eliqible for its
- students to participate in the Mississippi Resident Tuition 162
- 163 Assistance Grant Program, the institution shall comply with the
- 164 following requirements:
- 165 A complete and accurate roster of the eligibility
- 166 status of each awarded student shall be made to the board for each
- 167 term, semester or quarter of the academic year the student
- 168 receives a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant.

169	(b) The institution is required to make refunds to the
170	Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Fund for any funds
171	which have not been disbursed to the recipient, in the case of
172	students who have received a grant but who terminate enrollment
173	during the academic term, semester or quarter of the academic year
174	if an institution's refund policies permit a student to receive a
175	refund in such instance. The recipient shall be responsible for
176	the refund of any funds which have been disbursed by the
177	institution in such instance.

- 178 (c) If a student drops below full-time status but does
 179 not terminate all enrollment during the term, semester or quarter
 180 of the academic year no refund will be required for that term.
 181 However, that student is ineligible to receive the Mississippi
 182 Resident Tuition Assistance Grant during the following term,
 183 semester or quarter of the regular academic year.
- 184 The board may conduct its own annual audits of any 185 institution participating in the Mississippi Resident Tuition 186 Assistance Grant Program. The board may suspend or revoke an 187 institution's eligibility to receive future monies under the 188 program if it finds that the institution has not complied with the 189 provisions of this section. In determining a student's initial 190 eligibility, the number of prior semesters enrolled will not be 191 counted against the student.
- 192 (10) No student may receive a Mississippi Resident Tuition
 193 Assistance Grant for more than the equivalent semesters or

- quarters required to complete one (1) baccalaureate degree or one (1) certificate or associate degree program per institution.
- appropriated therefor, it is the intent of the Legislature to

 fully fund grant awards to eligible students. If funds are

 insufficient to fully fund grant awards to eligible students,

 grant awards shall be prorated among all eligible students. No

 student shall receive any combination of student financial aid in

 excess of the cost of attendance as defined in subsection (8)(a).
 - (12) No student receiving a Mississippi Eminent Scholars

 Grant as provided in Section 37-106-31 shall be eligible to

 receive the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant pursuant

 to Section 37-106-29 unless he is eligible for such award after

 the Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant has been considered by the

 board when conducting an assessment of the financial resources

 available to the student. In no case shall any student receive

 any combination of student financial aid that would exceed the

 cost of attendance, as defined in subsection (8)(a).
- 212 For purposes of this section, certificated shall mean, but
 213 not be limited to, all postsecondary vocational programs in
 214 eligible institutions as identified in subsection (4)(d) of this
 215 section.
- 216 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 217 and after July 1, 2013.
