A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing February 9, 2012, as "Community Health Centers Day"; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, federally qualified community health centers located in over 137 medically
- 3 underserved communities provide high quality primary and preventive health care to 400,000
- 4 people in the State of Georgia, including over 140,000 Medicaid recipients and 200,000
- 5 uninsured, the working poor, a large number of underinsured, elderly, homeless, immigrants,
- 6 and other vulnerable populations, without regard to income status, cultural or ethnic heritage,
- 7 or disease conditions; and
- 8 WHEREAS, community health centers add \$250 million per year to Georgia's economy
- 9 through indirect and induced economic activity, including \$118 million in household income
- and 2,025 Georgia jobs, that saves the Georgia Medicaid program up to 33 percent in annual
- spending per Medicaid beneficiary; and
- 12 WHEREAS, community health centers recruit and retain excellent health care professionals
- 13 where they are most needed and offer access to a wide range of cost-effective medical and
- 14 dental services, prescription medicines, health education, nutrition counseling, translation
- 15 services, community outreach transportation, and other support programs; and
- 16 WHEREAS, community health centers have a track record spanning four decades of
- 17 controlling costs, documented in several studies which show that rates of costly emergency
- 18 room visits, hospitalizations, and specialty care referrals are much lower among health center
- 19 patients than patients of other providers; and
- 20 WHEREAS, community health centers work in partnership with other health care providers,
- 21 local hospitals, health departments, social service agencies, and health related support
- 22 services to maximize resources and assure that services are coordinated to improve the health
- 23 status of the community; and

24 WHEREAS, community health centers have been innovators in the establishment of patient

- 25 centered medical homes, providing access to quality care and continuity of care for the
- 26 patients they serve; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Georgia's community health centers and their state organization, the Georgia
- 28 Association for Primary Health Care, have worked diligently to increase the number of
- 29 community health centers in Georgia and across the nation and have taken a leadership role
- 30 in establishing more centers in underserved communities to help resolve this state's health
- 31 care access problems, demonstrating commendable efforts in continuous quality
- 32 improvement, reduction of health disparities among the underserved, the implementation of
- 33 new health care initiatives such as electronic health records, and utilization of the latest
- 34 technology to improve both operations and delivery of services to more Georgians; and
- 35 WHEREAS, community health centers deserve commendation for their valuable
- 36 contributions in expanding access to health care, their outstanding record of service, and their
- 37 dedication to improving health care and the health status of all Georgians.
- 38 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 39 recognize February 9, 2012, as "Community Health Centers Day."
- 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 41 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the Georgia Association for Primary
- 42 Health Care.
