April 26, 2013	❖H-2C workers to be paid the greater of prevailing industry wage and state
	minimum wage; employers shall withhold 10% of pay to ensure adherence to stay limitations
	❖H-2C workers may be subject to binding arbitration and mediation of
	grievances as a condition of employment to discourage frivolous litigation against growers
	♣H-2C workers are not eligible legal assistance or public benefits, including
	refundable tax credits such as the Earned Income and Child Tax Credits.
	❖H-2C workers may not bring spouses or minor children

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❖Allocates 55,000 Green cards to foreign-born graduates of U.S. Universities
with degrees in Science, Technology, Engineering, or Math fields,
 Allocates an additional 10,000 visas for spouses and minor children
❖Increases H1-B visas, repeals employment based per-country caps
❖Establishment of Entrepreneur Visa program
 10,000 available visas to those who attract investment and create 3+ jobs
❖ Strengthening of Investor Visa program
o Indexes investment requirements for inflation, adds anti-fraud protection
Repeals the Diversity Lottery Green card program, and the Siblings of U.S.
Citizens Green Card program
❖Grants states and localities the ability to enforce federal and state
immigration laws, so long as they are consistent with federal laws
 Withholds grants from sanctuary cities
❖ Facilitates and expedites removal of criminal aliens
❖ Expands the Visa Security Program to additional high risk posts; authorizes
Department of Homeland Security & State Department to revoke visas if in
the security or foreign policy interests of the U.S
❖ Extends the authority of ICE officers to include arrests for immigration
violations, federal felonies, federal criminal offenses for bringing in and
harboring unlawful immigrants, and offenses against the U.S.
*Requires an annual report to Congress regarding the abuse of prosecutorial
discretion by the Administration
❖ Prohibits the Department of Interior and Agriculture from preventing Border
Patrol agents access to lands within 100 miles of the border
❖Bars illegal immigrants who threaten national security form becoming
naturalized
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
